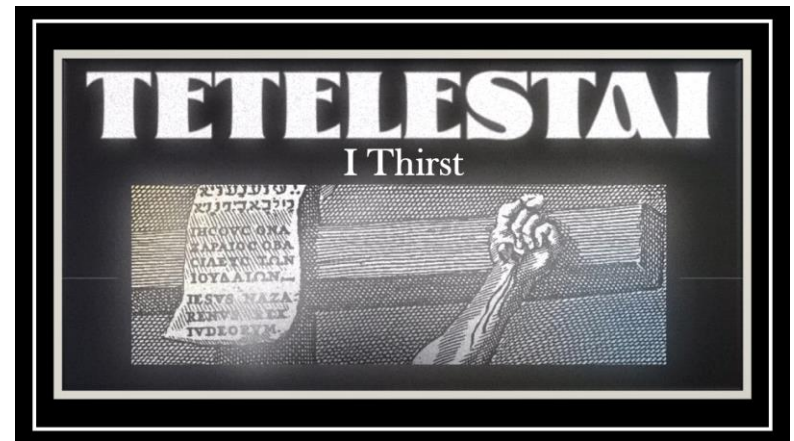


## Prayer Requests

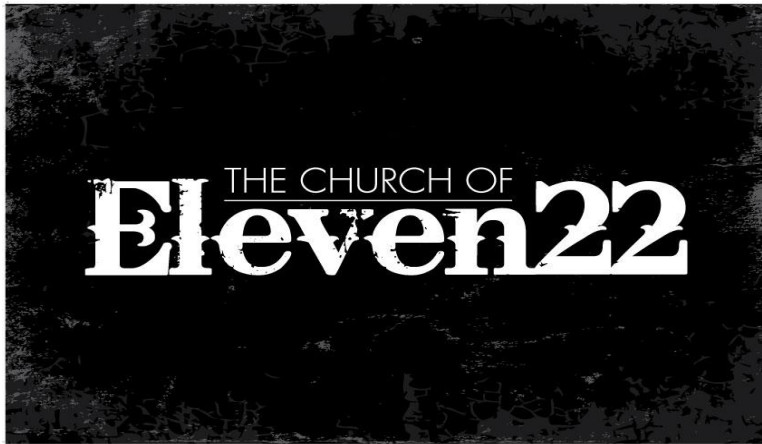
- June – Recovery of her sister, Lynne from post cancer surgery. Praise that the service for her sister, Britta was wonderful celebration of her life with family & friends.
