

1 Timothy 6 (ESV)

Teach and urge these things. 3 If anyone teaches a different doctrine and does not agree with the sound words of our Lord Jesus Christ and the teaching that accords with godliness, 4 he is puffed up with conceit and understands nothing. He has an unhealthy craving for controversy and for quarrels about words, which produce envy, dissension, slander, evil suspicions, 5 and constant friction among people who are depraved in mind and deprived of the truth, imagining that godliness is a means

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6 But godliness with contentment is great gain, 7 for we brought nothing into the world, and we cannot take anything out of the world. 8 But if we have food and clothing, with these we will be content. 9 But those who desire to be rich fall into temptation, into a snare, into many senseless and harmful desires that plunge people into ruin and destruction. 10 For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evils. It is through this craving that some have wandered away from the faith and pierced themselves with many pangs.

Good Works

- True wealth is measured by the good you do for others, not the possessions you gather.
- Our legacy should be based on kindness, helping others & living out our faith.
- We are called to live as Jesus did, serving others selflessly.
- Good works are not about earning salvation.

Good Works

- Good works reflect our
 - Gratitude for God's grace.
 - Commitment to God's mission.
- By doing good, we participate in spreading the love of Jesus.



Generosity

- Generosity is a heart condition, not a financial one.
- It's about having an open heart to help others in need, regardless of financial status.
- Being ready to share means being prepared to give at any time.
- As we give, we grow in faith.

Generosity

- Generosity
 - Transforms lives & communities,
 - Breaks cycles of poverty & suffering,
 - Brings hope & transformation,
 - Leads to spiritual growth,
 - Brings joy to both the giver & the receiver,
 - Reflects God's love for us & His character.



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True Life

- Paul cautions against being caught up in the love of money & materialism.
- We are warned that chasing after wealth leads to destruction & it can distract us from what truly gives life— God Himself.
- We are encouraged to be content with what we have & to seek the things that bring lasting fulfillment.

True Life

- True life is not about accumulating wealth but about knowing Jesus & living for His glory.
- In Jesus, we find peace, purpose & eternal life.
- When we focus on eternity, we realize that life is not about what we can acquire here on earth, but what we can give & invest in God's kingdom.
- As we approach the end of our lives, we are called to focus on eternal values, leaving a legacy of faith, love & good works.

True Life

- True peace comes when we are content with what God has given us, trusting that He will provide all we need.
- The pursuit of money, status & success will pass away, but the good works we do for Jesus will last for eternity.

Practical Applications

- Ask yourself if your focus is on eternal things or temporary pleasures.
- Focus on being content with what you have.
- Look for opportunities to give, whether it's your time, resources, or encouragement.
- Remember that all we have belongs to God, and we are called to steward it wisely.

- Rest in the knowledge that God will provide for your needs.
- Talk to others about how God has blessed you & how He is enough.
- Look for opportunities to bless others.
